President's Message

Meeting Site Changed to School

RHCA Elections on Tap March 22

The Rose Hill Civic Association will be meeting at Rose Hill Elementary School for the foreseeable future because a computerized reservation system for the community room does not recognize our long association with the fourth Tuesday of each month. It apparently is first come, first served and someone has beat us to it for at least the next three months. In the past, the library blocked out time for RHCA meetings, but no more. Sadly, the library computer does not recognize the organization that is right under their nose and has met there since the facility opened many years ago. True, we were slow on the draw in making a reservation, but we didn't know it was a race. Hopefully, the substitute users of the community room will be as supportive of the library as RHCA, but I doubt it.

The good news is that Principal Terri Czarniak of Rose Hill Elementary has filled the void and welcomed our visits. We'll be meeting at the school in March, April and May. We hope to be quick enough on the draw to get back to the Library in June.

In accordance with our bylaws, the March meeting is the date of our annual elections. The

current president, vice president and treasurer are available for reelection and nominations will be accepted from the floor. If you have any ideas about how to improve RHCA or the community, this is the time to share them with us.

Assessments, Budget update

By now, everyone should have received their assessment notice from the County. Unless you made an improvement within the last year, your total value should have declined somewhat. The County Executive has proposed a tax rate of \$1.09 per \$100 so the average bill for Rose Hill residents will be slightly lower than 2010. However, that is not the case County-wide where there has been a slight increase in home values. As a result, the average taxpayer will owe approximately \$110 more than last year. The budget also includes a \$30 million surplus, so a slight reduction in the tax rate is also possible.

The budget contains no new programs and does not reinstitute any that were cut last year. The schools still get the lion's share of our tax dollars...53 percent of the total budget. And that doesn't include an approximately \$59 million in services other County agencies provide the school system without reimbursement.

For example, the police department pays for school crossing guards and school resource officers to the tune of \$7 million. Seems to me that the school system could find the funds within its massive budget to fund those items and allow the money to be used for more patrol officers. I have suggested that the County begin a program to hire 20 new patrol officers each year for the next five years by redirecting funds both within the police budget and some payment by the school for services rendered.

After four years, those officers will get us back to the level of service that has been cut over the last TWO years. We have lost 18 positions within the police budget and the equivalent of another 59 positions through cuts in overtime pay. Rose Hill Civic Association members have been consistent in naming public safety as their main priority. Our investigations have shown that there are less police on patrol in the area than we deem necessary to maintain community safety.

If you have any questions pertaining to the budget, plan to attend the March 22 meeting at Rose Hill Elementary School. We'll provide you the answer if we can and get it for you later if we cannot.

Save Our Silos

By now, you probably have seen our signs asking that the silos from the original Rose Hill farm be saved. The owner of the Kindercare site on May Boulevard, which contains the silos, has filed a development plan with the county seeking to build 13 houses and tear down the silos. The structures are at least 100 years old and are emblematic of Rose Hill and Franconia's agricultural past. Go to myrosehill.com and read the narrative. If you agree, send me an e-mail indicating your support for saving the silos. I'd like to have a folder chock full of printouts to show both the owner and the County. The members present at the February meeting approved the expenditure for the signs. Hopefully, they will help the owner decide to reconfigure his proposed development to save the silos. If not, one might wonder why there is a Silo Road across the street. Some have asked who will be in charge of maintaining the silos if they are saved. One thing at a time. Let's save them first, then work on obtaining private and public support for their maintenance. After all, even at almost 100 and apparently structurally sound, they aren't in danger of falling down. One would hope that the owner would see the opportunity for increased value by maintaining the ambiance of the structures.

Rose Hill Beauties

It's almost time for the Rose Hill Beauty program. Judges will tour the neighborhood and notice properties that are deserving of the coveted award. Remember, only RHCA members

are eligible to have signs placed in their yards. If you'd like to volunteer as a judge, give Carl Sell or Linda Nichols a call or send them an e-mail. Or, if you want to make sure your property, or that of a neighbor, gets the once over call or e-mail Carl or Linda. There are over 700 homes in Rose Hill and each one gets a look. Such things as neat and trimmed lawns and shrubbery, flowers and fresh paint help catch the judge's eyes. Keep the trash from accumulating on the carport or around the house. Cars parked on the grass will definitely cause a property to be disqualified! While making their round looking for Beauties, the judges and members of Neighborhood Watch also will be making notes about properties that are not up to par and will report such things as wrecked, inoperable or unlicensed vehicles, an accumulation of trash, overcrowding, code violations, overgrown lawns, etc. This spring, we intend to reward those who keep their property looking good and will report those who don't. You can help by letting RHCA know about potential violations.

Rose Hill Reserve Update

There has been no agreement on a program to fix the landslide on the private property hillside above the intersection of Haystack Road and Split Rock Road. In the meantime, another slide has occurred in the same area. The developer has proposed the installation of 38 caissons filled with concrete to hold the hillside above the pond that is designed to collect runoff from the site. The County must approve the plan and the property owners have to agree to allow the work. In other issues, it has been a constant battle to keep the development and noise, mud, water, dust, etc. confined to the site. There continues to be a large amount of dirt being moved to and from the site as the County requires that marine clay be removed and clean fill placed as a base for each house site. The first model has been built and is open as a sales office. The lots will be built on as they are sold, so potentially we could begin to have new neighbors by fall. Rose Hill Reserve will have its own Homeowners Association with mandatory dues and rules. The new owners will be responsible for maintaining the undisturbed buffer. Those living adjacent to the property are reminded that nothing can be built in the open space, so if you see a new neighbor building a shed or clearing the trees, they are barred from

doing so by County ordinance and risk fines and/or a court appearance. We fought hard to save what trees there are left and don't want to see them defaced or destroyed.

The Voice of a Member

Unfortunately, most of the residents of Rose Hill are NOT members of RHCA. However, those of us who join yearly are very loud. We demand others respect both the property they occupy and the community at large. That's the best way to protect our investment and maintain a safe environment. If you are not a member, and want to protect your investment, join with your neighbors who feel the same way. Take a look at the names listed on pages 4 and 5. If yours isn't there make sure it is for the April Rambler. This is the last month of our membership drive for 2011. We don't knock on doors or call you at dinnertime. That in itself should motivate you to join! In order for our voice to be heard, we need your support. We complain to the County about rundown properties, overcrowding, wrecked or inoperable vehicles and other eyesores that detract from our community. Make a statement about how you want the community you live in to look. Join RHCA. Help us encourage those who detract from our community to join us in establishing pride in our property and neighborhood. Your membership, along with hundreds of others, shows outsiders that there are many shoulders to the wheel in Rose Hill. Over the last few years, we have made a difference. It is a continuous battle and each one unfortunately takes time. The best way to get the County's attention is through an active civic association with a large membership. We are active, we just need more members to underscore our effort. Believe me, numbers are important, especially when they represent the commitment to a vibrant, clean and safe community. Franconia Civil War History

President Lincoln, as portrayed by Dan Storch, will make two appearances in the Civil War program, sponsored by the Franconia Museum, Saturday and Sunday, May 14 and 15, at the Robert E. Lee Recreation Center in Lee

District Park. He will be there at 11 a.m. Saturday to talk about the massive explosion at Fort Lyon, now the site of the Huntington Metro Station. He will return at 1:30 p.m. to read the Emancipation Proclamation as part of a presentation on Black History in Franconia during the Civil War. Storch is the Mount Vernon District representative on the Fairfax County School Board. The program will run from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, May 14 and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday, May 15. The program is part of the sesquicentennial of the Civil War. A full schedule of presentations on life in Franconia in the 1860's is scheduled. The schedule can be obtained at franconiamuseum.org and will be printed in the April Rambler. One of the highlights will be a report from a farm kitchen during that period with free samples. That will occur starting at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday.

History buffs also might like to join the Museum's bus tour on April 23. The plan is to follow the footsteps of both armies to Manassas and then learn about the first major battle of the war. The tour will start at what would become Fort Lyon and follow Union troops up what is now Franconia Road past Rose Hill. After lunch, the group will tour the Manassas Battlefield Visitor's Center and attend a memorial service for all who died there conducted by Confederate General D.H. Hill, portrayed by Doug Batson, a Gulf War veteran. Information about the tour can be obtained at either myrosehill.com, Franconiamuseum.org or by calling Don Hakenson at 703-971-4894.

Finally, this month's history lesson involving Rose Hill in the war has to do with the Grand March of the Army of the Potomac down Pennsylvania Avenue at the conclusion of the war. Did you know that General Sherman's army camped at Rose Hill while cleaning uniforms, muskets and cannons, polishing swords and horse's reins and generally sharpening up its appearance in preparation for the review by President Andrew Johnson, General U.S. Grant and other dignitaries?
