Rose Hill Reserve Update

Over the summer, it has been one issue after another regarding the development of the new homes in our community. From constant truck traffic, arrogant drivers, dust, dirt and stones, high water on Rose Hill Drive and massive breaches of storm water erosion controls that inundated neighbors below the project, there has been one nightmare after another. And that comes on top of earlier landslides on the hillside leading up to May Boulevard, the use of Haystack Road as a haul route and the dramatic increase of truck traffic needed to dispose of marine clay on the site and bring in stable soil. At this point, we are concentrating on getting damage repaired. At its June meeting, RHCA agreed to mount a protest against all of the above by letting potential buyers know their new lots would be in an area of marine clay. We have delayed that effort in the belief that resolution of the many claims will require cooperation among everyone involved. Examples include cracked interior walls from the truck traffic, standing water on Rose Hill Drive because of controls required by the County to clean debris from runoff, inadequate design to control runoff that has inundated yards, downed and leaning trees, dust, dirt, mud and stones kicked up by earth-moving machines and trucks. It should be noted that Supervisor McKay's office has been very supportive of Rose Hill during this ordeal. As is often the case, Stanley Martin Homes is developing the site but was NOT involved in the original agreements among

the county, the landowner and the community. And, the County staff dealing with the issue does not have the necessary background and understanding of the problems at the site. So, it behooves RHCA to constantly educate all those involved. Unfortunately, they don't listen as well as they should.

Vehicle Vandalism

Several weeks ago, 54 cars were the target of vandals armed with a pellet gun or BB gun in the Franconia area. Included were cars parked in Rose Hill on Rose Hill Drive at May Boulevard, Willowood Lane, Thornwood Drive and Saddle Tree Drive. Fairfax County police and Crime Solvers are seeking help from the public in apprehending those responsible for the damage. Total damage is estimated at \$15,000. If you have any information, please call Fairfax County Crime Solvers at 1-866-411-TIPS. You do not have to give your name and a reward of up to \$1,000 is involved if your tip leads to an arrest and conviction. If you saw something, say something!

vandals some time back. Someone broke the Plexiglas cover that protects the sign. It was penetrated, but the sign itself was not damaged. Pearl Watts, who installed the cover, has agreed to make the necessary repairs. And, an errant driver ran across the median in the middle of Leewood Drive near Franconia Road, knocking down the RHCA 50th anniversary sign. Thanks to Donnie Krause, the sign is back in place.

Meeting Dates, Sites

Because the Fairfax County Library system has gone to a computerized process to reserve its meeting rooms, it is no longer possible to reserve a room on specific dates for the entire year in advance. Therefore, RHCA has to compete with the entire County in order to reserve its meeting space at the John Marshall Library. If we don't log in first, we are out of luck. Up until this year, RHCA had been meeting at John Marshall on the fourth Tuesday of the month nine times a year since the library opened in the 1970s. I don't understand why, but the process does not allow for certain dates to be set aside, even for a community organization that has historically met at the facility. It does no good to remind the Library system that RHCA was one of the prime supporters that allowed John Marshall to be built in Rose Hill on land that didn't cost the county a cent. So far, our dinners in the front yard at the Nichols and cooperation from Rose Hill Elementary have enabled RHCA to maintain its meeting schedule. Given the situation at the library, we're going to have to discuss moving our historic meeting date or search for a new site. It will take a better person than the electronically challenged president to keep up with the library system.

Both Sides Tour

The Franconia Museum's popular bus tours of Civil War sites continue with a trip to the Shenandoah Valley on Saturday, November 5. Stops include Stonewall Jackson's headquarters in Winchester, the nearby Kernstown battlefield at Rose Hill where Jackson suffered his only defeat in 1862, and the Holy Cross Abbey near Berryville that was the site of an 1864 battle. Included is a stop at the Abbey gift shop where the famous fruitcakes and truffles made by the Holy Cross monks

are on sale. The \$100 fee includes a seat on the bus, all entrance fees, lunch (including tip) at the Golden Corral in Winchester and a \$5 snack card from McDonald's on the way home. Clean Streets Initiative

Fairfax County's Clean Streets Initiative is designed to clear communities of trash and debris left at the curb by uncaring residents. Often, a plié of debris is left when someone moves out in the middle of the night or on a weekend, either due to a foreclosure or eviction. Sometimes, permanent residents think the County will remove the mess at no cost. Not so. When a pile of debris is reported, the County will give the property owner 10 days to have it removed. If it is not, the County will remove it and bill the owner. If the bill is unpaid, it becomes a lien against the property. The County's Solid Waste Management agency and the Health Department are cooperating in this effort to keep debris from piling up in our community. RHCA has used this service on a number of occasions. If you see a pile of trash at the curb, report it by calling 703-246-2300. In the case of garbage, the process moves faster.

Our Nation's Landlord

Because of all the foreclosures, Fannie Mae has become the largest owner of residential properties in the United States. Several of the properties are in Rose Hill and some already have been resold. One of the proposals to reduce the inventory is for the federal government to get

in the rental business. Here in Rose Hill, we have had some problems with rental properties and therefore should be concerned about an absentee landlord, even if it is Uncle Sam. Although a few remain, it has taken a long time to clean up some problem properties in our community. We don't need the potential of additional problems. On the other hand, an abundance of foreclosures on the market will hurt normal resales. Therefore, RHCA will insist that our elected representatives place reasonable conditions as part of any rental leases to help make sure tenants take seriously their obligations as members of our community. If not, they and Uncle Sam will hear from us!

And finally.....

Here in Rose Hill we have made great strides in our continuing effort to clean up trash strewn and rundown properties, remove wrecked and disabled cars, discouraged parking on the grass and generally spruce up our neighborhood. This is a reminder to all that the Association will continue to look for violations and will report them to the proper authorities. We have a large group of committed residents who help keep our community looking good. If you need help, we will direct you to the proper county agency or arrange for home-town assistance. Please help us keep Rose Hill a great and secure place to live. And, by the way, we have a network of Neighborhood Watch personnel on every street, keeping an eye out 24/7. We always can use another set of eyes. Call us and we'll give you some suggestions as to what to look for.
