Re: Will-O-Wisp Metropolitan District 404 Application

Dear Mr. Carey:

As we discussed at our meeting on November 19, 2009, you requested that the District provide reduced stream flow parameters regarding the diversion for our 404 permit. I have attached the updated stream diversion chart below. These new principles are within the parameters of our previous service agreement as approved by Park County. Please review this at your earliest convenience. Mike Stratton our consultant will be conveying this to you,

WOW will agree to divert only 65% of the flow to which they would normally be allowed under the Operating Principles until a reservoir is constructed. 65% of the Operating Principles represents the existing 120 homes plus 250 new homes. The total of 370 homes is 65% of the total build out of 570 homes (or single family equivalents)
